	<p><b>John Bowman - Trustee</b></p> <p>John is now retired after a long career in construction management in the international oil and gas industry.</p> <p>He joined the Hampshire Genealogical Society in 2006 eventually becoming the Group Organiser for the Andover Group for two years. In 2018 he took on the role of Data Protection Lead and now also co-ordinates projects for the Society.</p>
	<p><b>Margaret Bowman - Trustee</b></p> <p>Margaret has taken a keen interest in family history for 35 years. After joining the Society in 2006 she helped to run the Andover group for two years and organised visits to The National Archives and WDYTIA.</p> <p>In 2016 she took on the role of membership secretary.</p>
	<p><b>Philip Brown – Trustee</b></p> <p>Phil is a Professional Genealogist and Member of AGRA. Following a career at IBM as a Finance &amp; Planning Manager acquiring many different business skills, Phil left in 2014 to become a Genealogist and turn his hobby into a second career.</p> <p>Phil studied Genealogy with the Institute of Heraldic and Genealogical Studies (IHGS) gaining several qualifications up to the Diploma in Genealogy. Phil carries out numerous commissions for others to help them discover their family history and resolve brick walls.</p> <p>Phil joined HGS in 2014, he has attended the Romsey &amp; Fair Oak groups ever since, also giving a talk to several groups. **Kay Lovell – Vice Chair / Trustee**

Kay was recently Chair of her local u3a, and co-ran their Genealogy Group before moving away from the area. She is also a volunteer for The War Graves Photographic Project.



**Jane Painter- Secretary / Trustee**

Jane joined HGS in 2008, at the same time as leaving a career in the development and support of software solutions for international financial institutions.

She is the Group Organiser of the HGS Fareham Group, a member of the Media Committee, and administrator of the Group information on the Society website.

Inspired by a chance visit to Titchfield and finding an ancestor’s grave, Jane researches her own family history, friends’ families, random interesting people... To her, family history is about investigating all aspects of an ancestor – *where did they live? what was their occupation? what was going on in their village?*



Jane is very involved with the Wickham History Society, researching local families, including those on the local war memorial, houses, and events. Her current personal project is researching the Hampshire County Lunatic Asylum, looking at the history of the institution, the staff, and the patients, many of whom have tragic stories.



**Fiona Ranger – Trustee**

Fiona’s interest in family history was sparked when as a youngster she was shown a family tree which had been constructed by an ancestor of hers from the 19<sup>th</sup> century, she was hooked – she still has a copy! Over the years her research has taken her to many counties within the United Kingdom and further afield to Australia, Canada, and parts of Europe.

Fiona is a professional genealogist and speaker and is an associate of AGRA (The Association of Genealogists and Researchers in Archives). She believes that personal development is a priority and at present she is

	<p>studying with the IHGS (The Institute of Heraldic and Genealogical Studies) on their Correspondence Course and has also taken numerous courses with Pharos Tutors.</p> <p>For several years Fiona ran a branch of the Berkshire Family History Society and in 2015 she relocated to her birth county of Hampshire. She joined the Hampshire Genealogy Society (HGS) and became the Portsmouth group leader for several years. She has been co-hosting the International and National groups of HGS since their formation. This year she will become the bookstall manager for HGS and will attend in person shows and online events.</p> <p>Fiona is a qualified RHS (Royal Horticultural Society) Horticulturist and runs her own garden design and maintenance business.</p>
	<p><b>Anthony Sinclair – Chairman / Trustee</b></p> <p>Tony retired in March 2019, having worked as a Hampshire Police Officer for thirty years, followed by nineteen years with Hampshire Children's Services.</p> <p>He joined HGS in 1998 when he began researching his Family History after he had heard family members discussing French ancestors who came to England in the nineteenth century to escape the aftermath of the French Revolution.</p> <p>In May 2019 he volunteered to lead the newly re-formed Winchester Group. The Group was the first in HGS to run 'Hybrid Meetings' with members meeting together sharing their meeting, via Zoom, with members joining in from wherever they may be.</p> <p>Tony has experience of acting as a Trustee. During his children's early school years, he acted as Honorary Treasurer to their Primary School PTA. At around about the same time, he began volunteering with a Charity in Southampton which provided help and support to Adults with a Disability and was their Honorary Treasurer.</p>
	<p><b>Ann-Marie Shearer – Treasurer / Trustee</b></p> <p>Ann-Marie has always enjoyed history and read History and American Studies at university. After graduation she decided to train as a Chartered Accountant, working firstly in practice as an auditor and then in industry as the Company Accountant with a local business.</p> <p>She became seriously interested in genealogy over twenty years ago and joined Hampshire Genealogical Society to benefit from the expertise available, although she has yet to find any Hampshire ancestors. Following her retirement, she volunteered to act as Treasurer for HGS.</p>



**Susan Stannard – Trustee**
